



POLICE REPORT – APRIL 2017

Last month in March we received 364 calls from members of the public relating to incidents across the three parishes.

Crime Alert

March's figures for burglaries have remained fairly low across the beat with 3 in LFE, 2 in Kirby Muxloe and 4 in Glenfield. The offences in LFE appear to be that of car key burglaries, and therefore I would strongly urge residents not to keep these on show or within easy reach. As part of crime prevention I would also suggest using steering locks where possible to act as a further deterrent. We continue to target burglary as a priority with the hope that this continues to decrease.

Unfortunately car crime is on the increase with 20 in Glenfield, 9 across LFE and 3 in Kirby Muxloe. I cannot emphasize enough the message for residents to ensure they are securing their vehicles and not leaving valuables on show.

As a breakdown in Glenfield 4 of the vehicles were no forced entry, 5 had been left insecure, 4 were theft of number plates and 7 were actual vehicles broken into using force. Kirby Muxloe had 1 with no forced entry, 1 theft of plates and 1 forced break. Finally the car breaks in LFE were all forced but 2 were theft of the whole vehicle. As you can see from this break down by taking a few more precautions where possible and taking due care we can significantly decrease this happening.

On a positive note a successful search warrant was carried out in LFE where a large amount of stolen goods were recovered, including cash, jewellery, phones, leading to an arrest.

Anti-Social Behaviour

As a result of the consultations we carried out, a public meeting was held on 15th March 2017 in regards to the continuing issues on Western Park Golf Club, over 60 local residents attended this and the information from Neil Evans was passed onto the residents. This was that the entrance to the park is to be opened up and a foot path placed there with no restrictions – this gives access from Blackthorn Drive. In addition to this residents will be kept updated via email as requested.

Glenfield youth club has now been closed as of Friday 24th March 2017. This was a decision made by the Parish Council due to ongoing issues of ASB in the youth club and spreading out to the surrounding areas from the majority of children attending.
