



Police Report – July 2016

In July we received 344 calls from members of the public relating to incidents across the three parishes.

Crime Alert

An address in Glenfield had a warrant executed where a quantity of Class A drugs was found. Persons were arrested and enquiries continue in relation to drugs supply.

Following two burglaries in Glenfield a person was arrested and has been charged with the burglaries.

What items do you leave in your vehicle overnight or whilst it is not in use that are on show? Any items could be attractive to an opportunist thief if left on show. Empty your vehicle of any valuable items and leave the glove box open. Wipe SAT NAV marks off of your window. Unfortunately car crime is a reality, however, everyone can do their bit to combat it.

Anti-Social Behaviour

In Leicester Forest East we have been made aware that some teenagers have been climbing on the roof of the Pavilion on Forest East Park using ladders. It is not safe to climb on roofs and in the past such action has resulted in damage. The beat team are patrolling the area and ask that parents reiterate to their children to behave in an appropriate manner whilst they enjoy the summer holidays.

Motorbikes using a pedestrian cut through has been highlighted to us and a number of registration numbers have been passed and we will be making contact with the drivers.

A number of neighbour issues have been reported to us this month. If you are having ongoing problems with your neighbour and the problems are persisting after you have tried to sort the problem out by speaking with them then we may be able to help. Report the issue on 101 or to Blaby District Council and an appropriate response will be given to help try and resolve the issue.

We also received a complaint of people vandalizing the football pitches at County Hall whilst trying to gain entry to them. CCTV footage has been obtained and we are investigating the matter.



Community Engagement

We spoke with dog walkers and other passers-by on Station Park in Glenfield and noted that anti-social behaviour at the location is on the increase. The beat team will be taking measures to target the location at the times when the problem was identified as an issue.

Residents in Kirby Muxloe have begun to try and raise an action group to combat speeding in the village. The beat team have been in touch with a resident who is coordinating the effort and offered any assistance we can give to combat the issue. With Community Speed Watch not having operated in the area for a few years, we may see the return of it as well as other potential methods of combatting speeding. These efforts will continue to be backed up by the regular enforcement days conducted by members of the beat team which operate across LFE, Kirby Muxloe and Glenfield.
